

Faculty of Business Administration (cont'd)

During discussion reference was made to Senate minutes of April 12, 1977, and September 11, 1979, which define the procedures approved by Senate for the issuing of General Certificates and Certificates of Proficiency and whether or not these procedures had been followed in the case of these certificates submitted by the Center for Management Development.

It was agreed that this item be referred back to the Senate Executive Committee to determine whether or not these certificates meet the requirements approved by Senate. In reviewing this matter the Senate Executive Committee was asked to consider the Senate minutes noted above as well as the number of certificates currently being issued by the University and the time frame established for such certificate programmes.

The motion was tabled.

62.10 Report of the Committee on Committees

At its last regular meeting held on February 9, 1982, Senate instructed the Committee on Committees to set up a Senate Ad Hoc Committee to review the appeal from Student Number 7218928. The following were nominated:

63. Affiliation of Queen's College with Memorial University

In a memorandum dated January 13, 1982, the Provost of Queen's College stated that Queen's College is re-instituting a programme of theological training. He requested that affiliation with Memorial University, which was suspended in May 1974 because of the cessation of theological studies at Queen's, be re-instated.

It was agreed that affiliation with Queen's College be re-instated.
