

Federation of Luther College with the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus

1. The Regina Council recommends the acceptance of Luther College as a federated college, the federation to become effective in the academic year 1967 provided that all of the terms and conditions of federation have been met.
2. The Council recommends that the following regulations under the Statutes of the Senate of the University of Saskatchewan be approved:

LUTHER COLLEGE

Luther College, which is hereinafter referred to as the College, shall be recognized as a federated college upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The officers and faculty of Luther College are entitled to full membership with power to vote on the following academic bodies:
  - (a) The Senate: The Principal of Luther to be a member.
  - (b) The University Council: The Principal, professors, associate professors, assistant professors and full-time lecturers to be members.
  - (c) The College of Arts and Science: The Principal and full-time staff members engaged in teaching classes recognized for the B.A. degree to be members.
2. Students enrolled in the College who have satisfied the University requirements for admission shall be admitted to such University classes as they are qualified to enter and continue therein on the same terms as other University students provided the fees for such classes have been paid to the College. Students enrolled in the University ordinarily, with the permission of the College, may take classes in the College recognized for the B.A. degree, provided that the fees required for such classes have been paid to the University. These conditions will apply provided the same annual tuition fee is required by both the College and the University.
3. The foregoing provision with regard to the tuition fee for the Arts and Science classes applies to the pre-professional classes.
4. All students enrolled in a professional school or College must pay the University the full tuition fee required for each year of the Professional course, though the University may grant credit for any class or classes taken in the College and accepted by the College of Arts and Science for the corresponding class required in a professional course.
5. Academic appointments to and promotions within the College shall be made by the Principal, but prior to making such appointments or promotions, the Principal shall secure the approval of the President.
6. The University will recognize instruction given by the College in English, History, Philosophy, French, German, Mathematics and Psychology and such other subjects as may from time to time be agreed upon.

Provided that the instruction is given by competent teachers and that the work done in each class is equivalent in extent and standards to that given in the University. This equivalence is to be determined by the Head of the Department in the College and the Head of the Department or Chairman of Division in the University working out in co-operation the extent of the classes, the standard and all the particulars pertaining to the subjects, including the examinations to their mutual satisfaction or, in cases of difficulties, to the satisfaction of the President of the University.

7. The University shall confer the B.A. degree on such students of the College as have satisfied the requirements prescribed by the University for admission and for the B.A. curriculum.

3. Because of an apparent ambiguity in the wording of the amended wording of item 1 (2) of Statute XVIII of the Senate as this wording was approved by Senate on May 11, 1964 it is recommended that the following words be deleted: "(other than Instructors, Special Lecturers and Sessional Lecturers)".

The amended wording of Statute XVIII item 1 (2) reads as follows:

Members of the college teaching staff (other than Instructors, Special Lecturers and Sessional Lecturers) teaching the above University courses or classes must possess qualifications sufficiently high to be recognized as members of the Faculty of Arts and Science and shall be so recognized. In November 1964 the Senate agreed to amend the Statutes concerning representation on faculties to permit fulltime Instructors and Special Lecturers to be voting members of the College of Arts and Science at the Regina Campus.
